New Allergist in the Area

Dr. Daniel Reichmuth joins the East Pasco area as Florida Medical Clinic's new allergist. A Purdue graduate, he received his Doctor of Medicine degree from Indiana University School of Medicine in Indianapolis, Indiana. He then completed his internship and residency in Internal Medicine at the University of South Florida and served as Chief Resident at Tampa General Hospital.

Dr. Reichmuth is a Board Certified Doctor of Allergy and Asthma and also Internal Medicine. He is particularly interested in pediatric and adult allergy, asthma and immunology. His allergy and immunology training was performed at the James A. Haley VA Hospital, All Childrens Hospital, Tampa General Hospital and Moffitt Cancer Hospital and USF.

Dr. Reichmuth has authored more than 20 publications, presented a lecture on Anaphylaxis at the University of South Florida Internal Medicine Grand Rounds, and has been involved in many clinical, laboratory and pharmaceutical research projects. Dr. Reichmuth is currently a member of the American Academy of Allergy and Clinical Immunology, College of Allergy and Clinical Immunology and the American Medical Society.

Dr. Reichmuth will take a thorough history and conduct tests such as a scratch test or pulmonary function test, to determine what is triggering your symptoms and work with you to develop a management plan.

To determine if allergens are present, a scratch test or prick test is done. If symptoms persist, immunotherapy (allergy shots) may be a treatment option. This involves periodic injections of increasing amounts of allergen over a period of three to five years in an effort to make the immune system more tolerant to specific allergens and lessen the need for medications. For asthma problems, Pulmonary Function Tests are used to decide on proper treatment.
